Show starts with goats, lamb show will start immediately following the conclusion of the goat show

Exhibitors are responsible for reading and adhering to the rules.

Failure to adhere to any rules shall result in the disqualification of the entry and exhibitor.

- Show is open to exhibitor's 12th grade and under from any state
- Showmanship will be by grade, winners will then be judged in divisions to compete for buckles
- No limit on number of entries you can show
- Entries must be show ready. Sheep must be shorn and goats clipped
- All goats must be dehorned or have horns tipped
- Goats- Does and Wethers will show separately
- Lambs- Ewes and Wethers will show together
- The lamb show will be a GA. Club Lamb Association point show
- Class Weight: Animals will be weighed and divided into classes
- Exhibitor must use their own animal in showmanship or be disqualified.
- All animals must be tagged with some kind of identification number(that matches entry form)
- Heath Papers: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with the following statement must be shown. "No evidence foot rot, scabies, sore mouth, or cutaneous fungal disease." All animals should be listed separately on Certificate. All animals must have Scrapie Tag.
- Entry fee is \$25 per animal, \$10 for showmanship
- ENTRY DEADLINE: All entries must be postmarked by 6/19/19: Late entries \$40 per animal and must pay cash day of show
- Due to size of barn pens are 1st come 1st serve. Exhibitors may show off trailers if desired or when pens are full.
- No refunds will be given
- All Decisions made by the show committee are final/ the show committee reserves the right to review the rules and make changes if necessary
- Payouts will be determined by number of entries
